We are excited to share and celebrate with you many updates from this past year!

Early in the year, a special meeting of the corporation gave final approval to an updated constitution and by-laws. These new documents are serving us well!

The 2022 financial audit by Bauman and Associates was successfully completed. We will share briefly about this during the annual meeting, and anyone seeking more information can reach out to Executive Director Eric Klein.

The board continues to keep the strategic plan alive, reviewing it regularly during board meetings. This past Fall, the board held a retreat to provide further opportunity to dive into the strategic plan to ensure that it remains a living document. My thanks to Vice President Ted Bensen, who has been doing a great job making this happen! Ted will share a few updates during the annual meeting.

As we looked to the strategic plan, with so many needs and opportunities, it became obvious that the most critical need was to become financially sustainable for the long term before we could reach other goals. During this past year, we reimagined and revitalized the Growth and Development Committee. The committee is comprised of both board members and non-board members who have specific expertise in financial development. One of the things that became obvious to us is the need to add the position of Development Associate to the year-round staff. A job description has been created and we hope to move forward during early 2025.

Volunteers continue to make an impact on Luther Park! As a result, we had a successful Spring Work Day, a successful Heart for Luther Park Event, a successful Fall Work Day, and many other successes. A group of volunteers, led by Vice President Ted Bensen, designed and built four picnic shelters at Luther Woods, located at various spots throughout the property. These shelters are designed to be places for Bible Study, lunches, conversation, and rest stops during hikes. My thanks to all!

Luther Park became part of the Engaging Children in Worship Project, funded by a multi-year grant. Pastor Anna Sorenson, Luther Park Board and Project Co-Director, will share more about this during the annual meeting.

The year-round staff continues to be a rock star team! I am very proud of them! They are a blessing to all of us! Thank you!

I am also proud to be part of a very active board! They accomplish so much, both at monthly board meetings and in committee meetings. My thanks to all of them! They are the ones who make it all happen!

Finally, blessings and thanks to all of you who have built, served, supported, and shared in this sacred place for many generations. As we look to the future, we want to ensure that this place continues to grow and be a blessing for all those who will follow us.

Financial Committee Summary of the Luther Park 2022 Financial Audit

The auditor found the financial statements to be accurate and fairly presented, with no significant disagreements.

The financial statements of Luther Park Bible Camp for the year ended December 31, 2022, show a net increase in assets of \$58,196. A \$13,068 adjustment was necessary for additional capital asset costs. Essentially this error was related to the cost of building the ministry center. The \$13,068 needed to be added to the value of camp's assets.

The camp's primary source of revenue is donations, followed by guest group revenue and program revenue. The camp's expenses primarily relate to program services, management and general, and fundraising. The auditor's report states that the financial statements present fairly the financial position of the camp and its changes in net assets and cash flows.

However, the auditor also identified some weaknesses in the camp's internal controls, particularly in the areas of segregation of duties and record-keeping. The auditor recommends implementing stronger internal controls, improving record-keeping practices, and enhancing board oversight to address these weaknesses, which we have started to work on.

- 1. Weakness Lack of Strong Internal Controls: The Camp lacks a robust system of internal controls to ensure accurate financial reporting. This includes weaknesses in segregation of duties, especially regarding cash handling and approval processes.
 - How we have addressed it: Cash or check receipts are handled exclusively by office staff, deposit approvals are conducted by the Executive Director, and account reconciliations are independently performed by the out-of-office accounting firm, who is not involved in the receipt or approval processes. For checking disbursements, the out-of-office accounting firm prepares the checks, which require dual signatures from the Executive Director and a designated board member for amounts exceeding \$2,500. All reconciliations are subject to periodic reviews by the board to ensure compliance and maintain accountability. These measures provide a robust framework for safeguarding financial integrity.
- 2. Weakness Record-keeping: The Camp struggles with maintaining accurate and complete records, such as payroll records and detailed reports.
 - How we have addressed it: We have improved our record-keeping and have records on site where they can be easily found and accessed. We also keep and store electronic back-ups.
- 3. Weakness Insufficient Board Oversight: The Board of Directors needs to be more involved in overseeing financial matters, including approving pay rate changes and reviewing financial reports.
 - How we have addressed it: All pay rate changes are noted in minutes and all financial reports are reviewed not only by the Board of Directors but also by the Finance Committee and noted in minutes, which are kept. Reports are reviewed and approved monthly by the Board of Directors.
