John is also a member of the NWSWI Care of Creation Team which led to his participation in the EcoFaith Summit in Duluth since 2023, both as a member of the organizing committee and as a presenter. John led a small subcommittee of the Peace Lutheran Creation Care team to install a solar array that has been producing power since March 2023; he participated in helping Hope Village in Chippewa Falls to install a solar system with battery backup in 2023/24, and this past year he worked with Eric Klein to initiate a solar array project at Luther Park (that project is currently ongoing). John earned a B.S. in Chemistry from UW-River Falls and a Ph.D. in Analytical Chemistry from Purdue University in 1987. He has 3 children and 3 granddaughters (age 9, 7 and 3) of whom he is immensely proud! He enjoys being with family, loves the outdoors, and is an avid sports fan.
